On this National Indigenous Peoples Day, we are honoured to share photos from our first provincial tour, featuring Indigenous singer/songwriter Thea May and the Sudbury String Quartet.

The tour comprised 8 concerts and served hundreds of seniors who otherwise would not have access to these top-notch musicians. On Manitoulin Island, the musicians shared their story-based program with residents of the Wikwemikong Nursing Home, Manitoulin Centennial Manor, and TLC Home for Seniors.

The Wikwemikong residents gifted us a performance from their elder drum circle, their resident singer. Program Manager Matthew Assiniwe shared the story of his grandfather's flutes, the importance of identifying and sharing your gifts, and demonstrated the haunting sound of one of those flutes. It was a powerful and moving event. In Elliot Lake, the musicians performed for Huron Lodge, St. Joseph's Manor, and Hillside Park Retirement. In Sudbury, they played at Chartwell Westmount on William and Regent Manor Residence.

We are so grateful to have been able to connect and collaborate with these communities, sharing deep and healing musical experiences together.
